

# CALVARY CHAPEL IN ROCKLAND RE-OPENING INSTRUCTIONS

Reopening our church to gather together inside requires everyone to follow procedures that will keep people safe and help us remain in the building once we begin. Please accommodate the following procedures from the time you enter the parking lot until you leave the parking lot. We appreciate your observance of these necessary steps, it will make the work of those serving you more efficient and effective. **(see health requirements for service entrance are on page 2)**

**ENTERING THE BUILDING: (your name/family is assigned to the SAME SERVICE EACH WEEK, based on the re-opening form you turned in. Your name (with the quantity of adults you registered) is assigned to a section and pew location. You will be directed to that location by pastor Scott Greenberg and seated by a pastor, elder or deacon who is managing that section.**

1. Once you exit your car, please make sure you have your mask on **properly (covering nose & mouth)**, and do not remove it unless you are instructed to by the speaker at the pulpit.
2. Please stand in line under the canopy spaced at least 6 feet from others (family members can be together) as you enter the building. Tape on the front hall floor will help with proper distancing. **There is no hugging, hand shaking or touching at this time.**
3. As you enter the sanctuary through middle doors, give your name to the pastor Scott Greenberg so it can be checked off. At that time, let him know if all the people you put on your registration form are in attendance with you. Children can go right to Sunday school, if younger children need to be dropped off, please do that prior to getting back in line for the sanctuary check-in. Children 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and below are not required to wear masks or face coverings, it is up to the discretion of the parents. All other children must wear masks/face coverings.
  - a. If you have not filled out a Re-Opening form or talked to the office, your name will not be on the entry list. You will be asked to step out of line and if there is space to accommodate you, that will be determined once all registered families are seated.
4. At the end of the service, exit through the side corridor doors of the side of the sanctuary you are on, or the rear side door of the side of the sanctuary you are on.
  - a. **DO NOT** leave through the center doors of the sanctuary you entered.
  - b. **DO NOT** wander the hallways or hang around for fellowship inside the building (fellowship can be done after services in the parking lot with masks/social distance).
  - c. If you are seated on the office/bookstore side of the sanctuary, after exiting the sanctuary, please **exit the building through the bookstore exit doors.**
  - d. If you are on the Sunday school side of the sanctuary, after exiting the sanctuary (and collecting your children from Sunday school if applicable), exit the building through the **double front doors on the right** [as you leave] (you entered in through the double front doors on the left).
5. Service messages will be uploaded to YouTube for those unable to attend.
6. Weekly bulletins will only be posted online, they will not be handed out.
7. There will be no communion services at this time until they can be accomplished safely.
8. Currently, the church office is available for phone calls before, after service, and during the week at regular hours (Tues-Fri, 9-4). Please do not just “stop by” the office, call the office with any questions.

## HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR SERVICE ENTRANCE – SYMPTOM CHECKER

Before attending service, we ask that you conduct a screening of your health at home. This will involve taking temperatures, monitoring for symptoms, evaluating recent exposure to someone diagnosed with COVID-19, and recent travel questioning.

If the answer to any of the following pre-arrival screening questions is **“yes”**, you must remain at home and not attend service that day. You may also want to notify your health care provider if you are experiencing any of these symptoms or have had recent contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.

### Pre-Service Attendance Screening Questions

- Fever (100.0 Fahrenheit or higher), chills, or shaking chills
- Cough (Not due to other known cause, such as chronic cough)
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore Throat
- Headache (when in combination of other symptoms)
- Muscle aches or body aches
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Nasal Congestion or runny nose (not due to other known causes, such as allergies, and when in combination with other symptoms)

Additional questions that if you replay **“yes”** to, you must also remain at home and not attend service:

- Have you had recent contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or been instructed to isolate or quarantine due to COVID-19?
- Have you traveled to a domestic or international location that would require you to follow the protocols of the Massachusetts COVID-19 Travel Order? The travel orders can be found here:
